A message from Clinical Director, Annie Tran

Welcome to a brand new school year! We are happy to have new students and staff join the Kirkland family and we look forward to a great year full of learning. We are also excited to welcome the Training Classroom, led by the Director of Training Programs, David Cole. Having a training classroom helps Connections grows as a company and helps us offer more services to families in need. In the spirit of growth and service delivery, we recently opened up a new center in Lynnwood, and some of our students and staff have transitioned to the new center. As we begin a new school year, we invite families to review our Connections Policy. Because our center day is on a schedule it is important for students to arrive and get picked up on time. Our policy is that if students arrive or get picked up more than 15 minutes late, it will be recorded and considered a "late arrival/pick up." If your child has more than three late arrivals/pickups in a month, we will request a meeting with you to develop a plan to better support you with on-time arrivals/pickups. Parents and caregivers who have questions or concerns are encouraged to contact the Kirkland BCBAs at any time. Working together, we will provide the students with the consistency and tools needed to be successful.
